ELWOOD CCSD 203 Tax Levu

I want to take some time this newsletter to talk about the Elwood School Tax Levy. It's a complicated process, and this year, it is even more complicated than usual, so I will try to keep it simple so everyone understands the special circumstances that are in play this year. The Tax Levy is where I am given estimates of the total property value in our school district by the county (called EAV), and based on that estimate I request an amount of tax money from the county in the form of local property taxes. The tax money we receive is called a Tax Extension. So: $EAV \times Tax Rate = Tax Extension$

The second factor that impacts our Levy is called the Property Tax Extension Limitation Law (PTELL). This law says that in any given year, the tax money given to a school from existing property cannot increase by more than the Consumer Price Index (CPI) or 5% - whichever is less. So if the school received a \$1,000,000 Tax Extension, the next year they could receive no more than a \$1,050,000 Tax Extension.

Why this matters this year more than ever: As many of you already know, we have been in litigation with J Power over the property value of their new Combined Cycle Power Plant built in our school district for several years. We have finally reached a settlement with them. This is good news, but it does come with a one-year problem. That problem is that because of that settlement, this year's EAV has a significant drop from last year to this year. That EAV amount has decreased by almost \$188 million dollars from \$547,046,508 in 2023 to \$359,214,545 in 2024. That's a significant drop. All of that is to tell you this: Given that our EAV has fallen so dramatically this year, your Property Tax Rate will be going up to a similar rate that it was 2 years ago. If we don't do this, we will be crippling the amount of property tax the school can receive forever. (Remember, the amount of tax money a school can receive is limited - based on the amount they received in the previous year.)

Don't worry – the Elwood Board of Education has planned for this. The Board plans on issuing Property Tax Rebates to all Elwood School District homeowners this coming winter. The amount of those rebates remains to be seen, but it will help significantly with the issue.



Jackson Township's top priorities are maintaining its residents' safety and quality of life. Excess, unregulated, and wayward truck traffic coming through the township is a nuisance, and it creates major safety hazards. To maintain the township's integrity and support our priorities, the board regularly attends Joliet council meetings and meets with state and local officials to voice our residents' concerns and promote solutions.

On behalf of the Village Board of Elected Officials and the Village of Elwood "Team Elwood", I am proud to present the 2024 State of the Village Address as I highlight our many accomplishments over the past year.

In 2019, LB Anderson Land Holdings, Inc., and East Gate Logistics Park which are companies affiliated with the "Northpoint" development in the City of Joliet insisted that the Village of Elwood was required by an Annexation Agreement entered into in the year 2000 to allow a bridge to funnel truck traffic from the Northpoint Joliet Development into the Village of Elwood. A Will County judge agreed with Northpoint and ordered that the Village was required by the terms of the Annexation Agreement to allow the bridge. The



In connection with the issuance of the General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2023 the Village entered into an undertaking to file notice of certain reportable events. Among the reportable required events was a bond rating. In accordance with the Undertaking, S & P Global Ratings assigned the Bonds a credit rating of "A+" (Stable Outlook) on August 1, 2024 and affirmed it "A+" long term rating on the Village's general obligation bonds. Prior to August 1, 2024 the Bonds were not rated.

The Village was awarded GFOA's Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting. The certificate of achievement is the highest form of recognition in governmental accounting and financial reporting.

The Village budgeted and had built a cold storage building to hold public works equipment.

Through negotiation discussions CJ Logistics agreed to extend the pedestrian/bike path lying just north of the Elwood Fire Department to Diagonal Road. This will now connect a path from Diagonal Road all the way south and through Archer Park.

Administration Staff provided early voting opportunities for both the primary and general elections.

The multi-use building known as "The Hydrangea House" located in Lloyd Erickson Park is complete, looks fantastic and is ready for use. We are currently working on the rental use agreement.

Manhattan-Elwood Public Library, Elwood Branch is located at 111 E Mississippi Avenue and opened to the public on November 20th. We are very excited to have a library branch located in the Village of Elwood.

The Harding Development building construction is complete. Mr. Harding and I discussed a ribbon cutting ceremony and he would like to do that in the spring of 2025.

Jackson Township and the Village of Elwood worked together handing out Easter, Thanksgiving, and Christmas food baskets to help support those less fortunate.

The 2024 Lewis Plane Pull benefiting Special Olympics of Illinois was held at Lewis University. The Plane Pull featured the ultimate tug-of-war competition. The Elwood Police and Public Works team raised funds for the opportunity to test their strength by pulling a United Airlines passenger jet 12 feet as fast as possible. We were proud to announce Team Elwood took third place in the Public Safety Division.

Increased overweight truck enforcement by 78% over 2023.

Partnered with Elwood Fire Protection District in developing a drone program to improve public safety.

D.A.R.E program for the seventh-grade students at Elwood School District 203 and implemented a School Resource Officer.

FLAP Grant \$335,000 The team has been working on the project known as the Elwood Area Bike/Walking Trail Connector since 2022 and received notice on November 21, 2024, IDOT approved Phase 1 Study for the construction of a bike trail connecting the Village of Elwood and City of Wilmington. The project involves Phase 1 Engineering and Environmental Studies for bike and pedestrian accommodations. The project will create a pedestrian and cyclist connectivity between North Island Park in Wilmington and O'Conner Park in Elwood. We have a long way to go before completion, but we are on the right track.

Joliet Arsenal Development Authority awarded the Village of Elwood \$75,000 to assist with updating our Comprehensive Plan.

ComEd provided \$500 to assist with our Holiday Tree Lighting and Parade event.

Illinois Public Risk Safety Grant in the amount of \$3,028.00 was awarded to the Public Works Department.

\$50,000 Grant Funds to purchase Starcom 21 police radios.

DCEO Grant \$100,000 towards the installation of video surveillance cameras at Lloyd Erickson Park. DCEO Grant \$200,000 towards the construction of a public works salt dome building. DCEO Grant \$150,000 grant to upgrade and replacement of outdated water meters, technical hardware, and software replacement.
